





Subject: Officer Safety Equipment Upgrade

A. Purpose

County Council is requested to approve the purchase of 503 X26P Tasers from Taser International in the amount of \$585,025.92. This upgrade includes 37 additional units, and will replace, and tether, portions of existing equipment.

B. Background / Discussion

In the history of the Richland County Sheriff's Department RCSD, six (6) deputies have paid the ultimate sacrifice; dying in the line of duty.

Although crime is down, the violence of our crime continues to increase and the apathy toward law enforcement continues to rise. The overall need to make sure that our Deputies are the best trained and equipped to defend themselves and the citizenry is more important than ever.

Sheriff Leon Lott is committed to making sure that our Deputies use every de-escalation tool, at their disposal (verbal judo, professionalism and positive attitude, and communication and community empowerment), available to prevent physical altercations and interactions with suspects. However, it is sometimes necessary to take defensive actions to protect a victim, a deputy and in certain instances a suspect.

In 2013, there were 63 separate incidents, involving 69 Deputies, where the Deputies were assaulted. In these incidents, there were 43 bullets fired at 17 Deputies, coupled with 351 defensive actions with 215 Taser uses.

In 2014, RCSD had 42 Deputies assaulted, coupled with 336 defensive actions with 126 Taser uses.

No Deputy wants to use any force, but we must be prepared to use the force necessary to stop a threat against citizens or law enforcement.

The Taser provides Deputies with a less than lethal option that has been proven to lower injury to Deputies and suspects. This upgrade in equipment will allow Council to provide the best equipment to the RCSD in the most cost effective way.

C. Legislative / Chronological History

This is a needed upgrade due to the fact that the previous service contract and equipment life cycle ended on December 31, 2014. There is no legislative history associated with the request.

D. Financial Impact

The total cost of this request is \$585,025.92. There are no new funds being requested. Funding is available for the purchase of non-capital equipment in the RCSD FY2014-15 budget under the equipment bond, which was approved during the County's budgetary process.

This purchase will include a full service agreement that will cover all repairs and replacements and keep the equipment on duty with the Deputies.

A. Purpose

County Council is requested to approve a budget amendment from the Public Works Road Maintenance Fund Balance in the amount of \$900,000.00 to assist in funding the Low Volume Paving Program (Program).

B. Background / Discussion

On February 17, 2009, County Council approved an ordinance amendment to the County's Code of Ordinances (Section 21-3 and Section 21-20), creating an alternative dirt road paving program and adopting countywide dirt road paving program standards.

The ordinance amendment reduced the cross section width and pavement thicknesses on dirt roads that qualified for the Program, and allowed the County to pave more miles of road for less money.

The County's Public Works Department approached the CTC (Richland County Transportation Committee) for funding for paving low volume roads. The CTC allocated \$4,000,000.00 to the County for the Program. The County agreed to supplement that funding with an additional \$900,000.00. An engineering consultant developed a Low Volume Paving Manual, which served as the basis for the program.

At the November 1, 2011 Council meeting, Council approved the Program. To date, we have paved approximately forty (40) roads through the program, using funding from the abovementioned funds allocated by the CTC and funds provided through the County's Transportation Penny Program.

County Council approved the use of \$900,000.00 from the Road Maintenance Fund Balance; however, the funding was never allocated. At this time, we are requesting a budget amendment in the amount of \$900,000.00 to assist in funding the program.

C. Legislative / Chronological History

- 2/17/09 County Council approved the an ordinance amendment to the County's Code of Ordinances (Section 21-3 and Section 21-20), creating an alternative dirt road paving program and adopting Countywide dirt road paving program standards.
- 11/1/11 Council approved the Low Volume Paving Program.

D. Financial Impact

A budget amendment in the amount of \$900,000.00 is needed to supplement this Program to pave low volume roads in Richland County. The requested funds are available in the Road Maintenance Fund Balance. This action will require three (3) readings and a public hearing.





WHEREAS, on May 3, 1999, Richland County Council adopted the "Imagine Richland 2020 Comprehensive Plan" pursuant to S.C. Code Section 6-29- 310, et al. (Ordinance No. 013-99HR); and

WHEREAS, the 2009 Comprehensive Plan was amended on March 18, 2014 by the incorporation of the "Spring Hill Strategic Community Master Plan", dated December 2013 (Ordinance No. 008-14HR); and by the incorporation of the "Lower Richland Strategic Community Master Plan", dated December 2013 (Ordinance No. 009-14HR); and

WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Plan must be comprised of certain defined elements, including, but not limited to: (1) a population element, (2) an economic development element, (3) a natural resources element, (4) a cultural resources element, (5) a community facilities element, (6) a housing element, (7) a land use element, (8) a transportation element, and (9) a priority investment element; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 6-29-510 (E), the comprehensive plan, including all elements of it, must be updated at least every ten years; and

WHEREAS, Richland County's Planning and Development Services Department hired a qualified and reputable consultant to assist with the updating process, and took numerous steps to engage the public in this process, including: holding fifteen (15) community meetings, holding several meetings with identified stakeholders, having Home Builders Association (HBA) involvement and participation, reaching out to smaller municipalities, receiving feedback and direction from County Council members and Planning Commission members, and coordination with the City of Columbia, all of which occurred over a one year time frame; and

WHEREAS, the Richland County Planning Commission has recommended to County Council the adoption of an updated plan, said plan being dated December 1, 2014, and entitled "PLAN RICHLAND COUNTY"; and

WHEREAS, it appears to County Council that the Comprehensive Plan is comprised of all required elements, is proper in all other material respects, and that the adoption of the Plan is in the best interest of the County;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority granted by the Constitution and the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina, be it enacted by the County Council for Richland County as follows:





Following their review, the Committee directed Staff to reexamine possible souvenir options, including a souvenir coin and provide a recommendation to the Committee. Additionally, Staff was directed to research souvenirs used by other jurisdictions, including the City of Columbia.

The Columbia Regional Visitors Center (Visitors Center) sells merchandise, including t-shirts and tervis tumblers, which displays their "Famously Hot Columbia, SC" logo. This Agreement made and entered into by and between the County of Richland, a political subdivision of the State of South Carolina, hereinafter referred to as the "County", and the City of Forest Acres, a political subdivision of the State of South Carolina, hereinafter referred to as the "City";

WHEREAS, the City is desirous of providing an efficient and effective municipal court system utilizing the most qualified judicial personnel available;

WHEREAS, the City desires to utilize the services of Richland County Magistrate Phillip F. Newsom for the position of Forest Acres Associate Municipal Judge;

WHEREAS, the County is willing to permit Phillip F. Newsom to serve as the City of Forest Acres Associate Municipal Judge; and

WHEREAS, the County and City are authorized to enter into this Agreement by virtue of the provisions of Sections 4-9-40 and 14-25-25 of the South Carolina Code of Laws 1976, as amended, and as authorized by Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated May 25, 2001.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed by and between the City and County as follows:

- 1. Phillip F. Newsom shall serve as the City of Forest Acres Associate Municipal Court Judge.
- 2. Phillip F. Newsom shall perform all functions and provide such services to the City as have been customarily rendered by the City's Associate Municipal Judge, consisting of, but not limited to conducing bench and jury trials, issuing arrest warrants, setting bonds, and such other duties and functions as shall be performed as mutually agreed upon with by the parties and the Chief Municipal Judge of the City. The provision of such services shall be in a time and manner so as not to interfere with the Judge Phillip F. Newsom's regular duties with Richland County.
- 3. While actually performing the functions and duties of the Associate Municipal Judge, Phillip F. Newsom shall be totally responsible and dedicated to the benefit and objectives of the judicial system of the City, without interference from or influence by the County, its employees, or its Council.

- 4. In order to compensate the County for the services of a-Richland County Magistrate Phillip F. Subject: Richland County Conservation Commission (RCCC) Request to Negotiate Property Purchase

A. Purpose

County Council is requested to approve negotiations to purchase approximately 769 acres directly north and adjacent to the existing Mill Creek Mitigation property for conservation, mitigation and recreational purposes.

B. Background / Discussion

In 2013 Richland County Council approved the purchase of approximately 1,750 acres of an approximately 2,519 acre tract (see map in Appendix) for the creation of the Mill Creek Mitigation Bank (MCMB) for conservation, mitigation and future recreational uses as well as access to the Congaree River. The rest of the tract, commonly referred to as the Upper Tract, approximately 769 acres was retained by the Mitigation Bankers, Eco-Capital, Inc. (Eco-Capital). Eco-Capital wants to sell the property and has approached the RCCC with an offer to purchase.

The RCCC has been allowing funds to accumulate in the RCCC Fund established for the purpose of funding acquisitions and projects. County Council approval is required to expend these funds. The RCCC believes that the Upper Tract would be a good conservation purpose and the property could be easily used for recreation and education purposes.

The RCCC has investigated various options with Eco-Capital to purchase the property and offset the purchase price by increasing the portion of the amount we will be receiving from mitigation credit sales. The RCCC has also preliminarily discussed reducing the cost by timber sales, creation of mitigation credits on the Upper Tract, and spreading the costs out over 5 to 7 years with other entities. At this point to determine if an acceptable deal is possible for RCCC to purchase the property we need County Council approval to negotiate.

C. Legislative / Chronological History

This is a staff initiated request; therefore there is no legislative history.

D. Financial Impact

This information will be discussed in Executive Session as this Request of Action pertains to a contractual matter.

While this is at Counsel's discretion I ask that Council please note that within the ROA Financial Impact portion it is stated "Please note this ROA does not estimate maintenance costs after the property is purchased."

Although this property would not require the same level of maintenance as property purchased for citizen use such as parks and recreational areas, it is possible that part of the property will require maintenance to ensure we do not fail to adhere to our overgrown lot ordinance in the area of Old Bluff Rd. Maintenance of the property egress will also require some attention from the Public Works Department. It also appears, per the County GIS aerial map view that the property contains at least one vertical structure with currently maintained grounds, so a decision would be required as to any future maintenance or operation for any structures in order to establish associated maintenance costs.

As we move forward with programs that bring additional properties into our inventory, we need to determine responsibility, scope, and associated funding for each agency

The Richland Program Development Team (PDT) has reviewed the two (2) bids submitted for Greene Street – Phase I and Foundation Square. Following the review, Richland PDT communicated with both bidders and requested clarification on a limited number of identical bid items. The bidders were then given the opportunity to reevaluate their bid accordingly.

The resulting bids were as follows:

LAD Corporation \$ 12,820,113.45 AOS Specialties \$ 14,050,641.48

The Engineer's Estimate for this project was \$ 12,674,380.84 with the low bid being 1.1% greater than the estimate.

Further review shows that LAD Corporation is duly licensed in South Carolina to perform this work. A copy of their license is attached.

Attached is a final bid tab sheet for your reference. A review of the contract with the low bid shows a commitment of 1.1% utilization of Disadvantage Business Enterprise (DBE) and/or Small Local Business Enterprise (SLBE) companies. The low bidder has indicated that they will be able to increase this percentage without increasing their bid.

Richland PDT recommends that a contract be awarded to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, LAD Corporation. It is further recommended that the approval of the award also include a 10% contingency of \$1,282,011.00.

We will schedule the pre-construction conference once we have been notified by you that Council has approved the contract.

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<u>Subject</u>

- a. For projects funded with Richland County Transportation Sales Tax funds to be developed based on traffic projections for the design year 20 years beyond the scheduled construction date of the Project. For example, a scheduled construction start in 2015 would yield design year traffic projections for the year 2035. Where available, the local Central Midlands Council of Governments (CMCOG) traffic projections would be supplied for use in these planning activities. Where these CMCOG traffic projections are not available, the County shall make traffic projections based on standard industry methodology for the appropriate design year as indicated above. This should apply to any project funded with Richland County Transportation Sales Tax funds with the exception being projects where the purpose and need is strictly an enhancement such as: bikeways, sidewalks, neighborhood improvements, greenways, dirt road paving, and resurfacing.
