This program is for high school students beginning in the tenth grade. Students will be taught a curriculum that includes the science of flight as well as avionics. At the completion of this program, students that are interested in obtaining their FAA certificate will be well-prepared to obtain these in post-secondary technical school. Executive session – Began at 1:12 p.m. and concluded at 1:40 p.m. There were no votes taken nor business conducted while in Executive session.


<u>Adjournment</u> – The meeting adjourned at 1:42 p.m.





Aircraft complaints:
