

<u>Call to Order and Welcome</u> – Chairman Parrish called the Zoom Virtual Meeting to order at 12:02 p.m. and announced a quorum in attendance. **Mr Eversmann** delivered the invocation and welcomed everyone.

Report of Items for Executive Session – **Mr Eversmann** reported that there are no items that require an executive session.

<u>Approval of Agenda</u> – Chairman Parrish presented the agenda as distributed. Commissioner Medsker made a motion to approve the agenda as presented. Commissioner Squire seconded the motion, and all voted for approval.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u> – Chairman Parrish presented the minutes of the January 11, 2021 Airport Commission meeting for approval. Commissioner Medsker made a motion to approve the minutes as presented, Commissioner Squire seconded the motion, and all voted for approval.

<u>Chairman's Report / Executive Committee Report</u> – Chairman Parrish reported on the following:

- → City of Columbia Stormwater fees Seeking to mitigate the high cost of Stormwater Utility fees from the City of Columbia through re-negotiation of the land lease for the use of Owens Field Park.
- → Promoting Flight Instruction Reviewing current guiding documents in order to ensure that policies and procedures support the goal of promoting aviation through the development of future pilots by maximizing the availability of flight instruction opportunities.
- → Promotional Committee Seeking our peer airports and identifying best practices that could be applied at CUB.
- → Young Eagles Hoping for resumption in the near future following the forced hiatus due to the Covid-19 Pandemic.
- → Expiring Commissioner terms The initial appointment terms of **Commissioners Mousseau** and **Ott** have expired. Per the Bylaws, they may continue to serve until re-appointed or replacements are named.

<u>Operations & Facilities Committee</u> – Treasurer McCreary reported on the following:

→ Airport promotion – Working to ensure that all activity, projects, and initiatives are considered in the context of promoting the Airport and associated activity.

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→ Increase in aircraft sales – Despite some negative impacts of the Covid-19 Pandemic, aircraft sales are on the rise that bodes favorably for future airport activity.

<u>Promotional Committee</u> – In the absence of **Vice Chairman Kelly**, **Chairman Parrish** reported on the following:

- → Airport signage Working with the Airport General Manager to apply the concept successfully used at an Upstate peer airport of accessible informational signage that will help tell the story of the Airport and its features.
- → Post card promotion Acknowledgement of an initiative by former **Commissioner Smith** to promote the Airport through select mailing of post cards that he produced.

<u>Airport General Manager's Report</u> – A copy of **Mr Eversmann's** PowerPoint presentation is contained in the enclosure.

<u>County Liaison's Report</u> – County Liaison Terracio, reported on the following:

- → County budget process The Biennium Budget process (Fiscal Years (FY) 22 and 23) is underway. There is much uncertainty due to the impacts of the Covid-19 Pandemic.
- → Owens Field Park Though no final resolution has yet been reached, there are ongoing discussions at various levels on options regarding the Owens Field Park land lease and improving the revenue steam to the County / Airport.

Unfinished Business – There was no unfinished business conducted.

Executive Session – No executive session was conducted.


- → Contract awarded to Taylor Brothers.
- → Contracts and bonds are executed.
- → City of Columbia stormwater permit issued.
- → Pre Construction Conference conducted on May 14th.
- → Scope Taxilane Culvert Replacements / Forebay construction / Fuel Farm paved access road / Perimeter Fence ditch crossing / Perimeter Driveway apron installation
- → Substantially Complete / land disturbance permit closed out / Check dam removal / Final pay application (prepared by the project



Various Airport Site / Civil Improvements (Project 2)

- → 100% Federally Funded (CARES Act Provision)
- > Because of accelerated grant application deadlines imposed by the FAA, we are authorized to award the construction contract based on bids received last summer to AOS Specialty Contractors.
- → RC Council awarded contracts on July 14th.
- → Scope Taxiway A5 rehabilitation / Retaining wall extension / Infield drainage structure rehabilitation
- → AIP Grant accepted.
- → Purchase Orders (POs) issued. Contracts executed.
- → NTP Issued / Contractor mobilizing.







Runway Expansion Justification Study

- → Initially funded locally
- > If approved, FAA will reimburse and fund
- → Data collection / Outreach
- → Progress Meeting to wrap up outreach
- → Many thanks to Chairman for his "Pilot-to-Pilot" efforts

- → Safer landing in marginal WX → Greater range / full fuel loads
- Letters of support to account for at least 500 annual operations with an expanded runway
