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<u>Call to Order and Welcome</u> – Chairman Parrish called the Meeting to order at 12:00 p.m. and announced a quorum in attendance and welcomed everyone. **Mr Eversmann** delivered the invocation.

<u>Report of Items for Executive Session</u> – <u>Chairman Parrish</u> reported one item pertaining to a matter of intergovernmental relations that required an Executive Session.

<u>Approval of Agenda</u> – Chairman Parrish presented the agenda as distributed. Commissioner Medsker made a motion to approve the agenda as presented. Commissioner McLaurin seconded the motion, and all voted for approval.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u> – Chairman Parrish presented the minutes of the July 12, 2021 Airport Commission meeting for approval. Commissioner Medsker made a motion to approve the minutes as presented, Commissioner Ott seconded the motion, and all voted for approval.

<u>Chairman's Report / Executive Committee Report</u> – Chairman Parrish reported on the following:

- → Welcome back to in-person meeting;
- → He announced the resignation of **Commissioner Squire** due to family obligations and the appointment of **Commissioner Lynn Hutto**. He also congratulated **Commissioner Ott** on her reappointment.
- → Stormwater fees comments and concerns. **Chairman Parrish** inquired of the Richland County Administration Staff on the status of discussions with their City of Columbia counterparts on the Owens Field Part lease as an offset for costly Stormwater fees. Richland **County Administrator Leonardo Brown** stated that some internal staff coordination on this issue has taken place and that it has not been forgotten. It is, however, among a host of many important issues currently being managed at the County Administrator level at this time.

<u>Operations & Facilities Committee</u> – Commissioner McCreary reported on the following:

→ Fuel Farm vehicle crash – In the early morning of Saturday, July 31st, a vehicle traveling southeast on Jim Hamilton Blvd at an excessively high rate of speed crashed through the perimeter fence, became airborne, flipped over, damaged the Fuel Farm, and crashed through the perimeter fence along South Ott Road. There was no fire or explosion, but the Fuel Farm and Airport Perimeter Fence

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- were damaged. The fence damage was promptly repaired, but damages to the Fuel Farm will take longer to repair. The Fuel Farm is still operable.
- → Lightning strike On the evening of Thursday, August 19th, there was a severe lightning strike that damaged the following facilities or systems: Runway Lighting Regulator, Airfield Lighting Radio Controller, CATV, Internet, Network Connectivity, Security Camera System, Motorized Gate Access System. Most systems were mostly functional by close of business on the following day.
- → Updates on Runway Extension Study A virtual meeting was recently held with FAA Airports District Office (ADO) staff to discuss the upcoming update to the Airport Capital Improvement Plan (ACIP), the next Airport Improvement Program (AIP) Grant cycle, and the Runway Extension Study.

#### Promotional Committee - Vice Chairman Kelly, reported on the following:

- Airport signage and other efforts to provide the Airport story to the Community;
- → **Commissioner Medsker** gave a brief presentation on recent visits to EdVenture Children's Museum and The Challenger Learning Center.
- → **Chairman Parrish** stated his goal to build a partnership with Challenger Learning Center and EdVenture Children's Museum for promotion of aviation. He suggested that the Commission could conduct visits in the future to these locations for Commission meetings.

<u>Airport General Manager's Report</u> – A copy of **Mr Eversmann's** PowerPoint presentation is contained in the **enclosure (1)**.

<u>County Liaison's Report</u> – There was no report provided.

**Unfinished Business** – There was no unfinished business.

**Executive Session** – An Executive session was conducted beginning at 1:25 p.m. The Executive Session concluded at 1:43 p.m. Commissioner discussion ensued, but no business was conducted nor votes taken while in executive session.








#### Various Airport Site / Civil Improvements (Project 2)

#### Fuel Farm Vehicle Crash

- Early morning, Saturday, July 31st
- High speed vehicle traveling SE on Jim Hamilton Blvd.
- Missed slight curve, struck curb, became airborne.
- Damaged three sections of perimeter fence, UST vent pipes, AvGas elevated access manhole.
- No explosion or sparks.
- > Temporary break in perimeter fence (temporary repairs that day / fully repaired by the following Monday).
- Fuel Farm operational, but mobilizing a Contractor is difficult.
- → Future Capital Improvement Project.



#### Gear up landing



- → Occurred on Tuesday, August 3rd.
- → No injuries, explosion, or facility damage.
- + Quickly cleared and removed from the Runway

## Lightning strike

- → Occurred the evening of Thursday, August 19th.
- → Damaged: Runway Lighting Regulator, Airfield Lighting Radio Controller, CATV / Internet / Network Connectivity / Security Camera System / Motorized Gate Access
- → Many systems functioning partially by COB the following
- → Temporary bypass of Runway Lighting Regulator.
- → Required both Force Account as well as Vendor response.
- → Awaiting replacement of two circuit boards (back ordered)

## Hangar Break-in

- → Hangar Building 'B'
- → Discovered on August 24<sup>th</sup>
- > Involved two adjacent hangars.
- → Damage to one aircraft and hangar dividing wall
- → Under investigation by Columbia PD.
