- Property boundary lines
- Adjacent roads with road name and right-of-way width
- Adjacent owners and parcel numbers (TMS numbers)
- Lot numbers
- Lot sizes
- Waters/Wetlands Survey or Line and Curve Tables (notes which identify the origin of boundaries). If not, statement that no waters/wetlands are on the site

- Storm drainage profiles showing hydraulic grade lines
