Any candidate seeking a political party's nomination for any office in the 2024 General Election must file with the appropriate county board of voter registration & elections or the South Carolina State Election Commission during the upcoming filing period.

Filing opens noon, March 16, 2024, and closes noon, April 1, 2024

Filing Form: The Statement of Intention of Candidacy & Party Pledge (SICPP) form required for filing is available in the “Candidate Information” section of [scVOTES.gov](https://scvotes.gov) and at the county elections office.

Filing Fee: Filing fees are paid at the time of filing by candidates seeking the nomination of a party nominating by primary. The list of filing fees is available at [scVOTES.gov](https://scvotes.gov) and at the county elections

office. Filing fee checks must be made payable to the appropriate state political party. Candidates seeking the nomination of a party nominating by convention do not pay a filing fee.

State Ethics Filings: Candidates are required to file a Statement of Economic Interests and a Campaign Disclosure online with the State Ethics Commission at ethics.sc.gov. Failure to file these documents may result in a candidate fine but will not disqualify a candidate from the election. Contact the State Ethics Commission for more information.
