#### Airport Improvement Program (AIP) & Airport Capital Expenditures

- Primary means for financing Airport development projects
   Annual, recurring program
- Master Plan / Airport Layout Plan (ALP) (20-year planning document)
- → Airport Capital Improvement Plan (ACIP) (5-year programming document, updated annually)

  → Airport Capital

  → Airport Capit
- 90% FAA / 5% SCAC / 5% -RC
- Federal FY does not align with RC FY / Budget process

#### Airport Improvement Program (AIP) & Airport Capital Expenditures

- → Annual ACIP Update
- Preapplication / Exhibit / Environmental documentation (Dec)
- → Application / Supporting Documentation (May)
- Non-primary entitlement funding (\$150,000 / year)
- → Discretionary funding
- General Aviation v. Commercial Service
- Grant Assurances Financial self-sufficiency / Pavement Management System (PMS)
- → Airport Fund "Enterprise" / Source of Local Match Funding
- → Pavement eligibility Taxilanes will require greater local participation (in excess of the typical 5%)
- → Capital Improvement Fee (100% retained by the Sponsor unlike other revenue that is shared with the FBO)
- > Revenue generating facilities (hangars and fuel farms)

#### Airport Improvement Program (AIP) & Airport Capital Expenditures

Bi-Partisan Infrastructure Legislation (BIL) funds:

- → \$295,000 / year for five years
- → Managed similar to AIP Non-Primary Entitlement Funds
- > Inflationary trend in construction industry
- → Five percent of \$494,444 is \$24,722 (~ one month County Revenue)

Other Capital Expenditures (not associated with the AIP process):

- → Sewage Lift Station repair
- → Fuel Farm repair
- → Kitchen Equipment replacement
- > Bifold Door Gasket replacement




### Capital Improvement Fee

Between FY-17 (when the fee was initially implemented) through FY-21, it has generated \$38,178. This represents approximately 3% of total County Airport Revenue. Over that same five Fiscal Year (FY) period, our local match for FAA AIP projects alone has cost \$54.054. Please note that our expenditures during this same period were artificially low because:

- → Our FY-20 FAA Grant (AIP-026) was 100% Federally funded (instead of the usual 90%) due to the Covid-19 Pandemic; and
- → We did not execute an Airport Improvement Program Project in FY-21.

In other words, during a relatively low expenditure five year period, our expenditures exceeded Capital Improvement Fee revenue by \$15,876.
